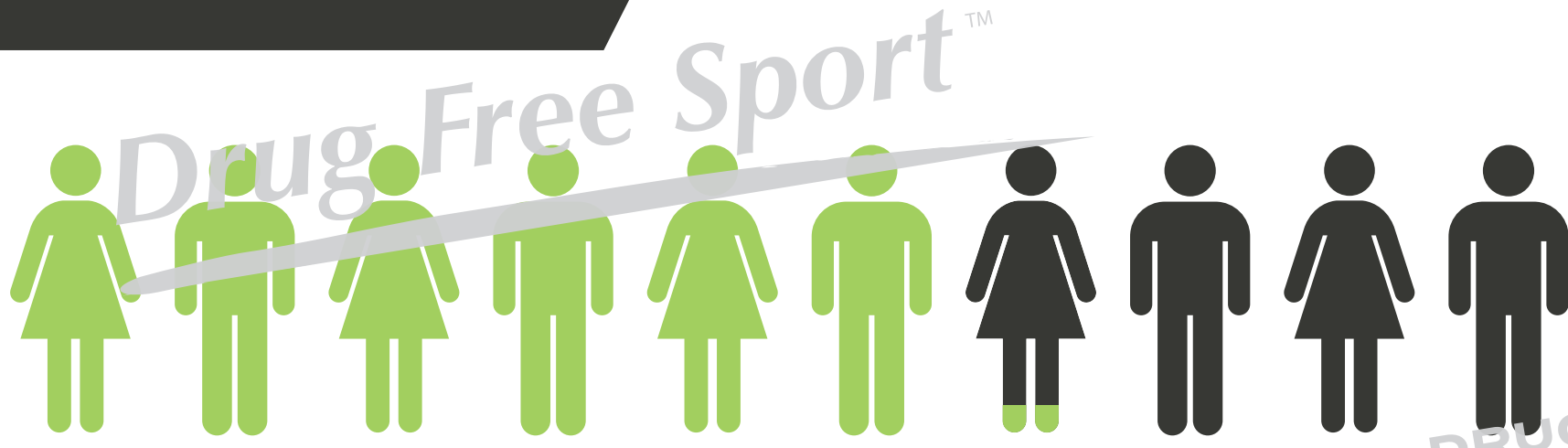

**CHANGES BRAIN STRUCTURE AND FUNCTION**

Prescription stimulants can rapidly increase dopamine levels in the brain. Increased dose, non-medical use, and long-term use increase the risk of addiction.

**DOES NOT MAKE YOU SMARTER**  
Prescription stimulants increase alertness, keeping the user awake, but research does NOT support that taking these medications improves learning or cognitive function in persons without ADHD.

**NO ADHD = BIG DRUG TESTING PROBLEM**

Athletes testing positive for amphetamines (like Adderall or Vyvanse) without appropriate medical exception documentation for ADHD will be sanctioned. NCAA sanctions for 1st positive drug test equates to a loss of two years of play time (loss of one competitive season in all sports and ineligible to compete for 365 days from the date of the drug test).
