

SUBSTANCE ABUSE POLICY

PRE-LICENSE CHECKLIST

NASCAR Cup Series, NASCAR O'Reilly Auto Parts Series and NASCAR CRAFTSMAN Truck Series

REMEMBER: NASCAR **will not** accept results from non-NASCAR testing programs. NASCAR substance abuse testing is also separate and distinct from federally mandated US DOT testing or from private company testing programs.

1. IDENTIFY WHO NEEDS TO BE TESTED

Anyone who may perform any of the roles listed on the NASCAR Event Roster or who will serve as a NASCAR Official, must have a pre-license drug test from a NASCAR pre-approved provider. This includes but is not limited to:

- NASCAR Officials
- Drivers
- Organizational Positions
- Road Crew Positions
- Pit Crew Positions
- Hauler Drivers

**Allow 3-5 business days if not longer for testing. Go ahead and have all your substitutes and backups tested so they are ready to compete too.*

***Pre-License test results are valid for 90 days towards a license application.*

2. CONTACT DRUG FREE SPORT (DFS)

DFS can be contacted by visiting www.drugfreesport.com/nascar, emailing prelicense@drugfreesport.com or by calling 816.474.8655. By using DFS, your negative results can be reported automatically to NASCAR.

**International competitors should contact DFS at the earliest time possible to make arrangements.*

3. SCHEDULE TESTS FOR TEAM MEMBERS

Tests can be conducted at locations around the U.S. or even at your team's shop. Allow at least three to five business days for results.

4. BE SURE TO TAKE A PHOTO ID TO TESTING

And always check that your ID numbers are correct. Transcription errors can cause a delay in the reporting of your results.

5. KEEP YOUR LAB PAPERWORK

After your test, you are provided a Custody & Control Form. Keep that paperwork so you always have the Lab ID number.

6. CHECK YOUR RESULTS BEFORE SHOWING UP AT THE TRACK

Avoid problems with last minute tests. Make sure the results are negative and have been reported to NASCAR before arriving at track. Ask Drug Free Sport or other providers how to check results directly online.
